CHILDREN'S MINISTRY



The direction of LGK for 2021 was to discover new ways to connect kids/families to God, one another, and God's work in the world. We connected through both online and in-person times of fellowship, learning and praising God in song. LGK offered resources and posts for families on black history month and women's history month.

LGK FAMILY DAYS

Under the shade of the Douglas Fir trees, over 60 adults and children gathered once a month during the summer for connection and to worship through songs, games, refreshments and Bible stories.

ONLINE MINISTRY

LGK offered weekly online videos for both preschoolers and elementary aged children from January through May continues to reach out twice a month with online offerings last Fall.

MUSIC

2021 was another year of frequent "pivoting" for Lake Grove's Music Ministry. We began the year virtually with online worship and rehearsals on Zoom. The Sanctuary Choir took advantage of this unique learning environment to do an in-depth study of Handel's Messiah, culminating in a virtual project of the Hallelujah Chorus that was a highlight of the Easter season. Our Children's and Youth Choirs also started the year online, and put together a wonderful "Spring Sing" service from their homes.



As summer approached, we began a slow, careful transition to inperson music. Organ music and small group singing returned to the Sanctuary in June and the choir gathered for Summer Sings in the church parking lot. September saw the relaunch of piano-led worship at 8am, and all of our choirs were able to move indoors.
