DEAR MISSION FRIENDS AT LAKE GROVE,

My husband and I have been part of a book group that started as a result of the tragedy of 9/11/2001.

Our group members were of the same troubled mind – wondering how best to live our faith and hope following the shocking crisis in our country. We decided we needed to go back to the basics of our



confidence and trust in God, and the books we chose to study and discuss really did help us feel better grounded in faith once again. Our discussions were lively!

Although our group has changed in members, the purpose remains constant. We want to learn from some of Christianity's great teachers and examples of faithful living. So, currently we're reading Timothy Keller's most recent book, "Hope in Times of Fear". I recently started reading the book and have been pondering the introductory words about what hope really is. Keller states that the biblical word for hope is much stronger in meaning than what we usually understand hope to be. The better translation is "profound certainty". And this certainty is based on the "explosive event" of Jesus' death and resurrection. Keller reminds us that the disciples of Jesus were eye witnesses who could never deny the fact of the resurrection and therefore changed their lives forever. Suddenly, almost overnight, they recognized that life is not limited to earthly years, and thus the remainder of their earthly lives was totally altered.

This led me to remember how so many Christians I have been privileged to meet over the years, especially those living in challenging environments that sometimes seem "hopeless", were not without hope. They were living in the profound certainty of eternal life with their Savior and God. Our mission partners, both local and international, reflect this hope in how they live and work today. We are privileged as a church and as individuals to support them through our giving, prayers and volunteer work. As scripture teaches, how very beautiful are their feet – and their lives and vision!

How gracious of God to give us opportunities to support them, and to also choose to live our lives serving others with profound certainty of eternity and joy!
